SUBJECT: Composite Cylinder Label Error

PRODUCTS AFFECTED: All Survivair and Sperian Composite

Cylinders

[This Technical Bulletin replaces Technical Bulletin #138, which has been withdrawn.]

This Technical Bulletin addresses an error that has appeared on all composite cylinders sold under the Survivair and Sperian names.

The Warning label on our composite cylinders states the following:

Do not fill or use cylinders heated to $350^{\circ}F$ (177°C) or greater (CGA pamphlet C-6.1). Depressurize and destroy these cylinders.

The temperature stated is incorrect, the CGA standard that is referenced is the incorrect standard, and the correct CGA standard (C-6.2) has a temperature error in it and should not be used as a reference source for this issue until the standard has been revised. The label should therefore read as follows:

Do not fill or use cylinders heated to 180°F (82°C) or greater. Depressurize and destroy these cylinders.

In early April, 2012 our composite cylinders will be shipped with a new, correct label.

No action needs to be taken for cylinders in the field that contain labels with the incorrect information.
